Public Communication:

A scheduled time for public participation has been placed on the agenda at MPS Board of Education general meetings. The Board desires to hear the viewpoints of citizens throughout the district. Comments should be made to the Board and not to individuals in the audience and be related to school operations and programs. The Board will not hear personal complaints against any person (employee or student) connected with the school district. Comments must address topics that are on the agenda, **or the previous agenda**. If a citizen would like to add a topic to the school board agenda, arrangements must be made in advance with the Superintendent or School Board President. The Board reserves the right to eliminate or restrict the time allowed for public participation. The Board requests that comments are limited to five (5) minutes or less. Groups of individuals addressing a common concern are asked to designate a spokesperson.
