A. Policy FFK Suspension and Expulsion (FFK)

<u>Background Information</u>: Policy FFK *Suspension and Expulsion* has been changed to correspond with other North Dakota large school districts and assign the Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent to serve as the hearing officer for expulsions. The policy was approved for first reading on November 27, 2017.

Recommendation: It is recommended that Policy FFK *Suspension and Expulsion* be approved for second reading and final adoption, effective January 8, 2018.

B. Administrative Rule FFK-AR Suspension and Expulsion (<u>FFK-AR</u>)

<u>Background Information</u>: The Board is in the process of adopting a new policy for suspension and expulsion. This administrative rule supports the policy by explaining steps Administration will use to carry out the Board's policy.

Recommendation: It is recommended that the Board review Administrative Rule FFK-AR *Suspension and Expulsion* and offer recommendations for revision to Administration.

C. Exhibit FFK-E1 Suggested Expulsion Hearing Process for Students in General Education (<u>FFK-E1</u>) <u>Background Information</u>: Exhibit FFK-E1 outlines the process used to conduct an expulsion hearing for a student in general education.

Recommendation: It is recommended that the Board review Exhibit FFK-E2 and offer recommendations for revision to Administration.

B. Century High School Bids

<u>Background Information</u>: The District recently solicited bids for Century High School Family and Consumer Science casework. This is part of the CHS renovation that is being completed by district personnel. We received one bid from TMI Systems.

Recommendation: It is recommended that the Board award TMI Systems the bid for CHS FACS lab casework in the amount of \$32,907.

C. Policy Purchasing Authority (<u>HCAA</u>)

<u>Background Information</u>: Bismarck Public Schools business office would like to change the bidding threshold on small purchases from \$4,000 to \$3,500 to align with the Uniform Guidance. The Uniform Guidance is the Federal Office of Management and Budget Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards.

Recommendations: It is recommended that the Board should adopt the changes to HCAA in one reading as per Policy BDA, effective January 9, 2018. To waive two readings, a 2/3 majority is needed, as per BDA.
